

Bonnie Frost To Moderate Family Law Program For Paralegals & New Attorneys

On Tuesday, August 5, 2014, Bonnie C. The State Bar has recognized her contributions to its legislative efforts by awarding her the Distinguished Legislative Service Award in 2008. The Morris County Bar Association honored her with the Morris County Special Service Award in 2006. Bonnie has been instrumental in writing seven amicus curiae briefs on behalf of the State Bar and has argued more than 300 cases at the appellate level, of which 27 are published. For more
