What Is Alternative Dispute Resolution?

Alternative Dispute Resolution is a technique which allows parties to resolve conflict in an informal and non-adversarial manner outside of Court. It also allows parties to settle their disputes without being at the mercy of the Court's calendar, which is now even more limited than before as a result of coronavirus. Mediation and Arbitration are two types of alternative dispute resolution. In Mediation, a Court-approved or trained Mediator can assist parties to reach a mutually acceptable settlement and draft a Memorandum of Understanding, which memorializes the terms of the parties' settlement. In Arbitration, an Arbitrator can be charged by the parties to make decisions a Judge otherwise would make, and the parties can determine for themselves, in advance, whether they wish the Arbitrator's decision to be binding (includes waiver of right to subsequent trial before a Judge and appeal) or non-binding (includes preservation of right to subsequent trial before a Judge and appeal).
